OREM — Pinnacle Security will hold a 5K race Saturday to raise money for Sustain Haiti, a local nonprofit organization that provides humanitarian aid to earthquake-ravaged Haiti.

The race begins at the company's office, 1290 Sandhill Road, at 9 a.m. Participants may register online at

www.firstgiving.com/sustainhaiti5k or at a 8 a.m. on race day.

Proceeds will go to support Sustain Haiti's development projects in Leogane, Haiti, a city of approximately 100,000 people located 20 miles west of Port-au-Prince. Pinnacle employees have also conducted in-company fundraising.

Sustain Haiti was formed after a massive earthquake ravaged Haiti last January. More than 50 volunteers, many of whom live or attend school in the Provo-Orem area, raised money for numerous development projects over the summer. Projects included square-

foot gardening, business seminars, microcredit, clean water systems, hygiene training, English classes and orphanage service.
