Dozens of BYU students will spend their summer helping earthquake victims in Haiti.

Fifty students will be going to the earthquake-torn country. While there they will help start businesses, teach hygiene and sanitation, help with a clean water program and a gardening program.

The group says if it hadn't been for the quake, they probably wouldn't be going there.

"We probably wouldn't be doing this honestly although we recognize the need that Haiti has. It's the poorest country in the western hemisphere," said Ammon Franklin, Country Director. "Perhaps the earthquake has drawn our attention to it."
